ST JOHN PASSION

Tuesday 4 April, 7.30 pm

Tickets: £25, £18 & £10

On Tuesday 4 April 2023 at 7.30 pm in Hereford Cathedral, Hereford Cathedral Choir will be performing J S Bach's St John Passion, accompanied by the period-instrument orchestra Marches Baroque.

The performance, which also features a distinguished line-up of soloists, tells the story of the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus according to the account in St John's Gospel.

The cathedral choir's annual Holy Week performances of Bach's Passions have become a fixture in Hereford's musical diary in recent years, along with its biennial performances of his Christmas Oratorio.

Geraint Bowen, Director of Music at the cathedral, and conductor of the performance, said: "The forces which we are using – our cathedral choir and a small orchestra playing on period instruments – produce a sound which would

have been familiar to listeners in Bach's time, and which bring out the intensely dramatic qualities of this much-loved work, first performed in Leipzig almost 299 years ago. It is always inspiring to see how our choristers – some of whom are as young as 8 – engage with this wonderful music. I'm looking forward to it immensely."

The soloists joining the cathedral choir are David de Winter (Evangelist, tenor), Gareth Brynmor John (Christus), Rebecca Hardwick (soprano), Martha McLorinan (mezzo-soprano) and Malachy Frame (bass).

Tickets cost **£25 (front nave), £18 (rear nave) and £10 for individuals aged 25 and under (rear nave)** and are available to purchase online at www.herefordcathedral.org or from the Cathedral Shop either in person or on the phone (01432 374 210).

Here is an update from Vennture about their Winter Provision:

"Funding was secured for Vennture to work with the homeless; using The Merton Hub as a check in for the Night Shelter, a centre for medical checks and a source of support, linking individuals with other agencies and assisting with applications for long term accommodation. Relationships with agencies have been built upon and the benefits to the individuals are noticeable. Support at The Merton Hub has already come from:

- Turning Point
- Opticians - including free spectacles.
- District Nurses
- Hairdressers

The health care checks which have been carried out by the Vennture medical Intern team helped to identify several underlying medical concerns. All checks are voluntary and from the feedback, people feel more cared for. Following health care checks, Vennture is able to create tailored support plans for the individuals at the Night Shelter.
