



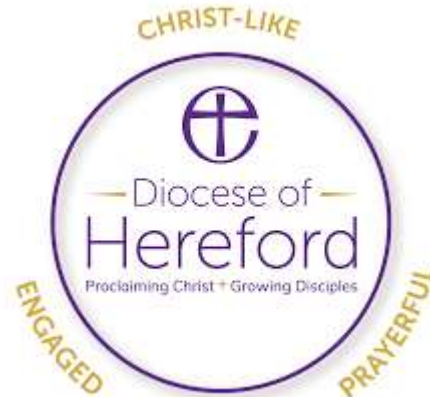

Monday 21 August, 11am – 3pm

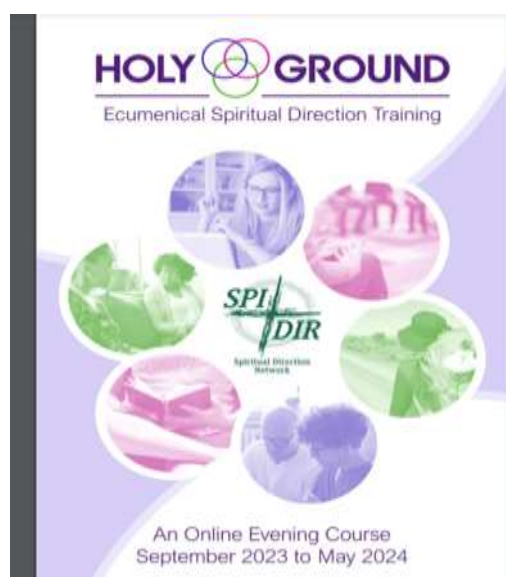

Holy Ground is an ecumenical spiritual direction training course for Christians who find themselves accompanying others on their spiritual journey. This may be in a formal capacity as a minister, pastoral assistant, or mentor, or perhaps you have noticed that others turn to you for a listening ear. This foundation course is ideal for all those who would like to train in the ministry of spiritual direction whether ordained or lay.

The course aims to:

- ☐ Explore the relationship of spiritual direction in the light of our own life experience and of the experience of being alongside others
- ☐ Develop skills, understanding and resources for accompanying and encouraging personal growth and fulfilment
- ☐ Nurture a growing competence and awareness of our own sense of vocation in relation to the Christian tradition of spiritual direction

COURSE CONTENT

The course will run over three terms, consisting of 22 online evening sessions (Thursdays 6.30-9.30pm), and 3 in-person day sessions (Saturdays 10am-4pm). In-person days will take place at St Francis Church, Amersham Road, High Wycombe HP13 5AB, which has plenty of parking and is accessible by public transport. Under certain circumstances these days may be accessed online. A dedicated Zoom link, and a secure online Student Portal for course resources and materials will also be provided.

The course will include:

- ☐ Theoretical sessions, in which the background and practice of spiritual direction will be explored, including:
 - Biblical and theological perspectives
 - Themes within Christian spirituality and spiritual direction
 - Issues concerned with human personality, psychology, and growth
- ☐ Experiences of different forms of spirituality and prayer relating to the spiritual journey

STUDENT COMMITMENT

Participants are required to:

☐ Be receiving regular ongoing spiritual direction. If you do not have a spiritual director at this time, please contact the SpiDir Network for a list of spiritual directors in your area: www.spidirnetwork.org.uk

☐ Complete assignments and recommended reading to assist reflection and learning

☐ Be open and willing to work with their own experience within the group context and in one-to-one spiritual direction practice sessions

☐ Participate in self, peer, and course evaluation to assist constructive development of self and others

A Certificate of Completion will be presented at the end of the course to all students who have attended at least 80% of the course, completed all assignments and paid all fees. Those students, for whom the tutors have discerned a vocation to the ministry of spiritual direction, will receive a recommendation to this ministry at the completion of the course.

COURSE TUTORS

The course is led by experienced spiritual directors and teachers both lay and ordained.

Joanna Gallant

Joanna is Vicar of St Francis of Assisi, Terriers, and was founder and Executive Director of Pelagos Spirituality & Retreat Centre from 2009-2019. She also ministers in a broader context of Christian spirituality as a teacher, external tutor for Ripon College Cuddesdon, spiritual director, supervisor, retreat leader and guide for the Ignatian Exercises. Joanna has an MA in Christian Spirituality from Heythrop College and loves walking with her husband and their black Labrador by the coast.

Nick Gallant

Nick is a spiritual director, tutor and supervisor, and was co-founder and Communications Director of Pelagos Spirituality & Retreat Centre from 2009-2019. He studied at the London

Centre for Spirituality where he learned to give the Ignatian Exercises and is currently writing a series of books on Ignatian spirituality. Nick has a passion for helping others deepen their faith and realise their true potential under God. As a former professional trombonist and singer, Nick loves to minister through music.

Beryl Maw

Beryl is an Oblate with an Anglican Contemplative Community. As a spiritual director she draws on a breadth of traditions, and notably the Ignatian tradition. She has a background in teaching, art and spiritual formation including offering retreat days and spiritual direction training. She enjoys walking, pilgrimage, painting and nature and often draws on these interests in her direction practice.

COURSE FEES

Course fees will be between £620 and £770 depending on numbers and can be paid in full at the beginning of the course, or in three termly instalments. A non-returnable deposit of £100 will be required on acceptance on the course, which will form part of the full fees.

Available grants

Some bursaries may be available by application to the SpiDir Network by emailing: info@spidirnetwork.org.uk. There are also a number of other sources of funding to explore, for example:

- ☐ Anglican clergy and LLMs may be eligible for CME grants or their equivalent from their own diocese, to cover some of the costs
- ☐ Grants from the Society of Retreat Conductors are available to assist those undergoing training in Ignatian spirituality (which is a fundamental aspect of the course). Apply at least 1 month prior to beginning the course.

- ☐ The Women's Continuing Ministerial Education Trust (WCMET) exists to support the ministerial development of women in the Church of England and the Scottish Episcopal Church. As part of Refugee Week 2023, The Diocese of Hereford has partnered with Mothers' Union Hereford to launch a clothing appeal, asking people to donate towards buying new clothes for those seeking asylum who are currently being hosted in the county.

Recognising the deep sense of dismay many people have felt after government plans to send Asylum Seekers to Rwanda, The Bishop of Hereford, The Rt Revd Richard Jackson, is asking people to consider blessing those seeking asylum who are currently housed in the Three Counties Hotel by donating to Mothers' Union and Hereford Diocese Clothing Appeal.

Funds from the appeal will be used to provide vouchers for the Asylum Seekers, enabling them to purchase essential items of clothing. Most of the individuals housed in the Three Counties Hotel arrived with no more than the clothes they were wearing.

The Bishop of Hereford, the Right Revd Richard Jackson, said. "I have always felt it is important to welcome our friends and neighbours and I have been overwhelmed by the generosity of our local community in supporting those fleeing their homes due to persecution and war, including countries such as Afghanistan, Syria, and Ukraine.

"That is why I am asking people to extend this welcome to all seeking refuge in our area, and to show compassion by supporting this campaign. I encourage people to give whatever they can afford. It will make a huge difference to these people who have travelled from conflict areas with nothing more than the clothes on their backs and fear in their hearts."

Sunday 19 June marked the start of Refugee Week which ran until Sunday 25 June. It is an annual event, the world's largest arts & culture festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary. Founded in 1998 in the UK and held every year around the World. This year, Refugee Week celebrates its 25th anniversary and people are invited to celebrate what compassion looks like in action. - Over the Phone
- By Email
- By Post (snail mail)
 - o ***We are not a counselling or advice service we are primarily a prayer Ministry!***

The telephone lines are open Monday to Friday 9am to 10pm and Saturday's 10am to 6pm.

Outside of these hours or whilst staffed by an operator, a caller can leave a **voicemail prayer request** or via the UCB website using the email functionality **24/7**.

The Prayerline Ministry/Service as mentioned earlier, is not a 'Counselling or Advice' service but is wholeheartedly a Prayerline ministry where our motto states, we are here to be **'Praying with you, Praying for you'** comes into play.

Calls continue to rise in the Prayerline ministry with an average of 400+ calls per day (often many more) overseen by just 126 faithful volunteers who provide us with 2 regular hours per week. The sheer nature of the calls have dramatically changed over the past couple of years meaning more time is being spent on individual calls. So, to support the expansion and the demand of the calls we are looking for volunteers who would be interested in this role. Do you have anyone you know who may be interested?
