The names 'Through the Roof' and 'Roofbreakers' come from the account in Luke's Gospel Chapter 5 when a disabled man was lowered through the roof to meet Jesus and amazing things happened – everyone benefitted, and God was glorified.

Light up a Life in the Community

Late every year, Herefordshire's hospice, St Michael's, hosts two Light up a Life events: one at the cathedral and one at the hospice itself. These events enable people to take part in an act of remembrance (which includes the lighting of a candle) for loved ones who have died. The hospice also invites community groups, especially churches, to take part in the initiative by hosting events in their own neighbourhoods. By doing so, together we can reach and support the greatest number of people who are facing the loss of a loved one. The hospice can supply orders of service as well as other supporting materials, as required. We hope that the county's Churches Together groups will be interested in taking part and, subject to availability, we can offer someone from the hospice to speak at these ecumenical services; if this would be of value. There is no set date for these events but, bearing in mind the busyness of the Christmas season, it may be that a late November or early December service would be appropriate. Herefordshire Vennture – Street Pastors



Our dedicated Street Pastors team works on the streets of Hereford to provide a safe and caring presence in our community's night-time economy. We partner with CCTV, door staff and emergency services to keep people safe on the streets, whether they are on a night out or in other situations where they may require help.

In teams of three, we walk through the city and respond to many different situations that those in our city at night-time may encounter, from hailing a taxi for someone to reconnecting them with loved ones or dealing with safeguarding issues. We are always willing to lend a listening ear to anyone who may need support. We also regularly give out items that those on a night out may find helpful, such as flip-flops, water bottles and blankets.

Our mission is to help Hereford get home safely. We take this mission very seriously and provide intensive training to our volunteers so that we can be prepared for a wide range of situations in which we may need to offer support. Our volunteers come from diverse backgrounds, working together as a team to support and encourage each other. We are committed to our community and seek to bring practical meaning to the 'power of Jesus' love.'

We're keen to recruit considerate, caring, trustworthy volunteers who are good decision makers, can stay calm under pressure and work well in a team.
