News from Churches Together Groups

Leominster

Churches Together in Leominster have responded to the call for people willing to help provide support to the asylum seekers newly moved to Leominster's Talbot Hotel. Members have helped distribute envelopes requesting financial donations and helped with the collection, and sorting of clothing and toys donated. They have been part of the team looking to provide language support on a voluntary basis. Also, they have offered a weekly town walk to encourage the Talbot residents' confidence around the town. The Leominster Asylum Seekers Support (LASS) team is led by staff from the Anglican diocese, but the members are made up from a variety of bodies and individuals both from different Christian denominations and secular.

We had our AGM in September and said thank you to our retiring Chairman Paul Scott who is stepping down after many years of service as Vice Chair and then Chair. We are grateful for his work and are glad he will continue to support us in the group.



Hereford

After the Good Friday Walk of Witness and the exhilaration of Easter, Christians Together in Hereford (CTH) have been quietly working over the summer, seeing how they want to be structured going forwards. 


Churches Together in England

**Join the Association of Interchurch Families' weekend conference online
14 - 15 October 2023**

Interchurch Families – Beacons of Receptive Ecumenism

An invitation to participate in the Association of Interchurch Families (AIF) weekend conference by joining all the main events via Zoom.

Receptive Ecumenism is sometimes defined as ‘... *both a way of thinking and a process that enables unity to be built by receiving gifts from others. It challenges us to think not of what others might benefit from receiving from us, but to recognise our needs and to put ourselves in the place of being a recipient.*’ Put simply, our church traditions should not be asking themselves “What do they need to learn from us?” but rather, “What do we need to learn from them?”. The hope is that if all our church traditions were to ask themselves this question and act upon it, we might all draw closer together in Christ’s family, while also deepening our own identity.

To married couples this sounds very familiar, for it is in the nature of marriage that couples should aim to learn from each other to help them grow together. For interchurch couples, learning about each other’s denomination helps us to develop a local sacramental practice of domestic church that is part of that growing together. During this two-day event we will explore how the experience and practice of interchurch families might offer our churches a lived example of Receptive Ecumenism in action.

Online attendees will be able to join online discussions groups when the in-person attendees convene in small groups, and they will also be able to attend the online services. Light up a Life in the Community

Late every year, Herefordshire's hospice, St Michael's, hosts two Light up a Life events: one at the cathedral and one at the hospice itself. These events enable people to take part in an act of remembrance (which includes the lighting of a candle) for loved ones who have died. The hospice also invites community groups, especially churches, to take part in the initiative by hosting events in their own neighbourhoods.

By doing so, together we can reach and support the greatest number of people who are facing the loss of a loved one. The hospice can supply orders of service as well as other supporting materials, as required.

We hope that the county's Churches Together groups will be interested in taking part and, subject to availability, we can offer someone from the hospice to speak at these ecumenical services; if this would be of value. There is no set date for these events but, bearing in mind the busyness of the Christmas season, it may be that a late November or early December service would be appropriate. This led to an evening of worship and conversation at St John's Methodist Church on Sunday 24th September attended by 23 people. The event was held in Café Church style, and we heard about IGB Birmingham and the Open Table Network. Following some tabletop discussion and plenary, several folk were identified as being a group to go forward to curate the next event, to find the right venue, to identify leaders for the group and seek funding. We will report back as soon as we've met.
