

5 Steps to becoming a Single Friendly Church


“We recognised that a single person's experience of church can be isolating, and we wanted to do all we could to change this.
- a Single Friendly Church

- 1 Who is single?**
 Single includes all ages and stages of life. You should consider the different types of singleness in your church and community.
- 2 Language**
 Review the language and images used in your services and publicity. Ensure it is inclusive of single people.
- 3 Welcome**
 Warmly welcome people coming and sitting alone. Create social opportunities after the service that fully include single people.
- 4 Teaching**
 Ensure sermon themes and applications are relevant for single people at all stages of life. Does your teaching value singleness as well as marriage?
- 5 Leadership**
 Are single people included in leadership at all levels in your church? e.g. small groups, service leading.
