Conference on Assisted Suicide

The Challenge of Assisted Suicide
Wednesday, 4th December, 10.30am-5.30pm
Pusey House, Oxford



'Choosing Life: the Challenge of Assisted Suicide' will be

a one-day conference hosted by **The Revd Prof Nigel Biggar, Distinguished Scholar-in-Residence at Pusey House and Regius Professor Emeritus of Moral and Pastoral Theology at the University of Oxford**, bringing together clergy, philosophers, theologians, doctors, lawyers, politicians and journalists to discuss the moral, political and legal challenges posed by attempts to legalise assisted suicide, from a broadly (but not exclusively) Christian perspective.

Headline theological speakers include **Willem Eijk, the Cardinal Archbishop of Utrecht; Vaughan Roberts, Rector of St Ebbe's, Oxford; Michael Langrish, sometime Bishop of Exeter and Prof David Jones of the Ancombe Centre**. Speakers will also discuss the current and prospective legal situation in Britain, the possibilities of serious opposition in the House of Commons and House of Lords, and the path trodden in Canada and the Netherlands.
