



We'd love to introduce our new **Community Support Team** who will represent our Humanitarian arm of the ministry here in our own backyard!





SPSJ Ukraine Project Intercultural Course

Unlock the potential of a thriving, diverse congregation with SPSJ's comprehensive diversity course, developed through the Ukrainian Project. This program has already supported over 250 refugees and 100+ sponsors, helping churches like yours embrace diversity and find new opportunities for growth. Through this initiative, our own congregation has grown by 10%, with more people being discipled and actively engaging in church life. As your leadership teams and congregation become more diverse, this course provides essential tools to navigate these changes, fostering a welcoming and unified church community.

Faith in Fostering initiative encourages people to foster with Herefordshire Council

Herefordshire Council are reaching out to ask for your help in addressing the national shortage of foster carers. Herefordshire Council currently has around 390 children in care and only 130 fostering households. This shortfall means children often have to move out of county, sometimes as far as Cornwall, London or even Scotland, in order to find a suitable home.

Herefordshire's foster carers provide incredible support to Herefordshire's children, but more people are required to help meet the needs of local young people in care.

Foster carers are kind, caring, patient and compassionate people who offer safe, stable and loving homes for children. We ask you to consider if you have these attributes and can give the time and space required to create brighter futures for local children.

Society for Ecumenical Studies Webinar: Receiving Christ in Holy Meals -




