CTiH Statement on the Recent Violent Disorder

Taizé Prayer Dore Abbey – 29th September

Taizé Prayer is very different from the usual church service. There is more time for your own thoughts and prayers and for silence. The repetitive chanting & the candle-lit Dore Abbey promotes an atmosphere that lends itself to contemplation. We sit in a circle with a cross and candles on the floor in the middle. Following in the footsteps of the brothers who founded the brotherhood at Taizé over 80 years ago, we encourage everyone to arrive and leave quietly. Each service lasts less than an hour and includes readings, repetitive chants, silences (one of at least 10 minutes) & prayers. If you have never been before and want to give it a try, 29th September is a great opportunity. There will be tea and cake available in the Abbey from 5.00 to meet others and receive an introduction to the service itself. There will then be a short break at 6.15 before moving into silent preparation for 6.30 prayers. Why not try something different?

A Time to Mourn, A Time to Dance is an hour-long professional production presented in-the-round with audiences on three sides.


