Churches Together in Weobley

Weobley Churches Together needs a *Holiday Club Coordinator*

Churches Together in Weobley is an ecumenical body made up of representatives from the Anglican, Methodist and Catholic churches in Weobley village. Over the past two years we have been running a holiday club for primary school age children in Weobley Parish Church three times per year (Easter, summer and Harvest) for 2 or 3 days. We currently have a vacancy for someone to lead our holiday club, which operates in the Church of St Peter and St Paul, Weobley.

The person we are looking for must be a Christian and in agreement with the vision and ethos of Churches Together in Weobley, have a loving heart for children and their families, and exercise skills for dealing with differences in

learning approaches and personality. They need to have a tolerance of world views different to their own. Previous relevant experience of working with children and families is essential.

The position involves:

- engagement with the hosting church, lay volunteers and families involved in the holiday clubs
- meeting with the Rector of Weobley parish church to prepare ideas, activities and materials for the holiday club
- assisting with necessary registrations and paperwork prior to each club and handling parent enquiries
- providing a supportive, caring, stimulating and safe environment for the duration of each club

"We held a short event each day of the octave, with each church hosting and running an event. This covered six of the days. On one of the other two days we held a Town Centre Prayer Walk, sporting our new hi-vis vests with the Churches Together logo, that we had decided to buy to use at the Walk of Witness. On the other we had our usual January meeting.

It was so good to share worship and prayer with our fellow churches with many additional attendees coming from the churches holding that meeting. Each church ran their session in their own style which is refreshing to our habits.

Some people attended all the events and some just one but we estimated upward of 70 people attended at some point. Maybe more, we didn't count up as we went along.

The subject matter from the resources wasn't always used and at these events we could enjoy the unity of sharing that time together. Where it was used we found the closer look at the words of the Nicæan Creed, so familiar to us, to be enlightening. I felt it brought home to me the complexity of beliefs and meaning held in the compacted words. Also the poetry of the composition stood out for me.

We have followed this pattern of holding daily events during the eight days for three years now and feel it has a lot to offer people."

Churches Together in Herefordshire – Herefordshire Vennture Jan 25



Additionally, SongShare will partner with churches to incorporate these songs into worship events and other programmes.

By embracing these songs, churches across Britain and Ireland can reflect the vibrant diversity of their congregations while fostering greater unity through worship.
