Reflection for CTiH

I recently attended an ecumenical service that took place at Hereford Cathedral to celebrate the 1700th anniversary of the Nicaean Creed. The service was organised by the C of E and Roman Catholics collectively working together to celebrate the significance of this anniversary with the Archbishop of Cardiff-Menevia speaking on unity that arose out of the decisions that were made.

Archbishop Mark O'Toole spoke about how "affective ecumenism leads to effective ecumenism." Essentially desiring unity leads to the affective outcome of unity. We constantly need to fuel the fire and remind ourselves of our motivations. Why are we here? What is the reason we work together to help spread the gospel? It's a plea from Jesus himself.

This was exactly what the Bishops did in 325 AD at Constantinople. They banded together to become more affective so they could help others understand the Gospel and also explain it in a structure that explained the crux of Christian belief.

The theme of sacrificial love is interwoven in the Nicaean Creed. It displays and honours God's might and the cost that it took so salvation was open to all.

Taking part in the joint worship and singing hymns such as *Kingsfold* by Timothy Dudley-Smith was incredibly moving. The line "renew, restore, unite, inspire. The Church that bears your name..." is incredibly profound; because however long you have walked with God it brings it back to the core that the Church bears his name. We are ambassadors for Christ and it is through his strength that the Church can be renewed, continuing to unite because we bear his name. He wants our heart. As long as we give Jesus our heart, there is nothing to be afraid of.

As we adopt this attitude, we can continue to turn affective ecumenism into effective ecumenism. This was the very significant action that the Bishops decided to take in 325 AD and may we continue to collectively carry out those actions in our community; remembering the crucial impact of affective ecumenism that took place 1700 years ago.

Barnfest



“This year we have changed the name to BarnFest and added more venues for children and young people to make it a complete family event. I would like to encourage you to come along and join us for all or part of the weekend. You may even like to bring your whole church along! Last year 43 different churches were represented and this year already 9 churches are planning to relocate their Sunday Service to the barn on the 6th July.

Our theme for the weekend will be Encounter Jesus with special guest speaker J John bringing two keynote messages. The Saturday evening will have a strong evangelistic focus and Sunday morning will have more of a celebratory focus. We are adding 4 marquees in the field alongside the barn for children and young people to have age relevant programmes running during the two main sessions so that they can encounter Jesus too.

A new feature this year will be to start with lunch (you will need to book for food) on the Saturday

followed by an afternoon of games on the field for families and seminars and live music by our refreshment marquee. The games will include; Inflatable Assault Course, Bungee Run, Bouncy Castles, the Faith Space Van (games, consols and activities), Volley ball, Garden games, Table Tennis challenge and more!

Entry will be free to all but you will need to register for the event and book in advance for food which will have a modest cost. Vennture



Vennture has a temporary accommodation facility at the former Merton Hotel in Hereford where we are currently providing housing and a safe space for those experiencing the effects of temporary homelessness – many with children. This means we need to provide warden cover and support 24/7.

We are needing more wardens to join the team to ensure our guests are safeguarded and the building is respected and looked after. There may be some responsibility for managing bookings and room allocations whilst on duty, along with general upkeep and health and safety duties as they arise.

We are particularly looking for someone who can work 16 hours a week over 2 shifts which are 5pm to 1am or 1am to 9am. There is an extra unsocial hours' payment for hours worked between 9pm and 9am.

Springs is inviting churches to host a performance of **Journey of the Magi**, which will be available nationally from 21st November – 22nd December 2025.



One thing to read ...

Is it possible that we may have missed a key purpose of the gospels? This book, **Jesus Wants to Train Us to Live His Life**, may dramatically affect how you read and respond to the story of Jesus. Using 57 questions and answers, this study book explores how the gospels and Acts are more than biographies. As well as calling readers to trust in Jesus Christ, the gospels include instruction and practices for us to imitate - to a level you may not have realised before. In the book, Rev'd Andrew Attwood from Coventry Diocese argues that Jesus and the early church modelled a life and mission to be adopted as the radical norm, and recorded it in the gospels.

The author introduces the gospels from an historical perspective, then focuses on how Jesus related to God. This model relationship was then demonstrated by his Spirit-led, disciple-making mission - a way of life to imitate. The author proposes that these reliable eye-witness stories were carefully structured by the authors as manuals for future followers.
