#### Visit by Revd David Hardman - Methodist Liaison officer for Jerusalem



"We had a very successful visit from David Hardman, the Methodist Liaison Officer for Jerusalem on the 22 July. David was joined by a recently returning EAPPI officer who told of their recent deployment. The sessions at both Bromyard and St John's Methodist Churches were well attended. We were also pleased to work with Hereford PSC in co-hosting the Hereford Event. The two events were very ecumenical in nature with folk from a number of denominations and none.

At our meetings, we considered the complexities of the situation on the ground, the history of Zionism, the part the UK have played in the history and politics of the place in the last century, the Nakba, the 1967 wars, and the ghettoisation of the Palestinian people. Together we agreed to condemn violence from both sides, and to also remember that the vast majority of Palestinian People are and have been "loving with a broken heart" and non-violently resisting occupation.

One other important topic we covered, was that sadly, many in the West have forgotten the Christians amid this conflict. David reminded us never to ask a Christian Palestinian when they "converted", as we should remember their ancestors became Christians at the very first Pentecost, and that they are the original Christians. Christians in the West Bank feel as if they have been forgotten by their siblings in the West. There are some beautiful churches, and beautiful people, trying their hardest to non-violently resist the hatred. Bethlehem has a Bible College and Jerusalem has an Anglican Cathedral and College.

What we live in hope for is Justice, justice for the Jews, justice for the Palestinians, both Christians and Muslims.

At the Hereford event, we were joined by some from the Jewish faith, who reminded us, that there are many Jews in our country who have been protesting alongside those calling for Justice and Peace and an end to the war, who say, "not in my name".

One of the main reasons for the event was to educate folk about the situation, to allow people to come to their own decisions, and to resource folk to have conversations and to pray to see Justice in the area. For those of you not able to

come, we can recommend some books that you might want to read.

The Methodist Church has recently signed up to the **World Council of Churches Statement on Palestine and Israel: A Call to End Apartheid, Occupation, and Impunity in Palestine and Israel**. Take a read of this, and maybe campaign with your church leaders to endorse this statement too. Take a read of the statement here

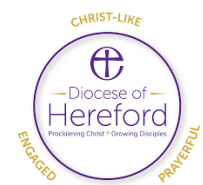
