Each session lasts about one and a half hours and begins with a video presented by Dr. Andrew Ollerton. There is time for discussion in small groups and the session ends with a short time of reflection. There is a participant's handbook available for £9.99, and it's recommended that you follow a daily bible reading plan to help prepare for each session. 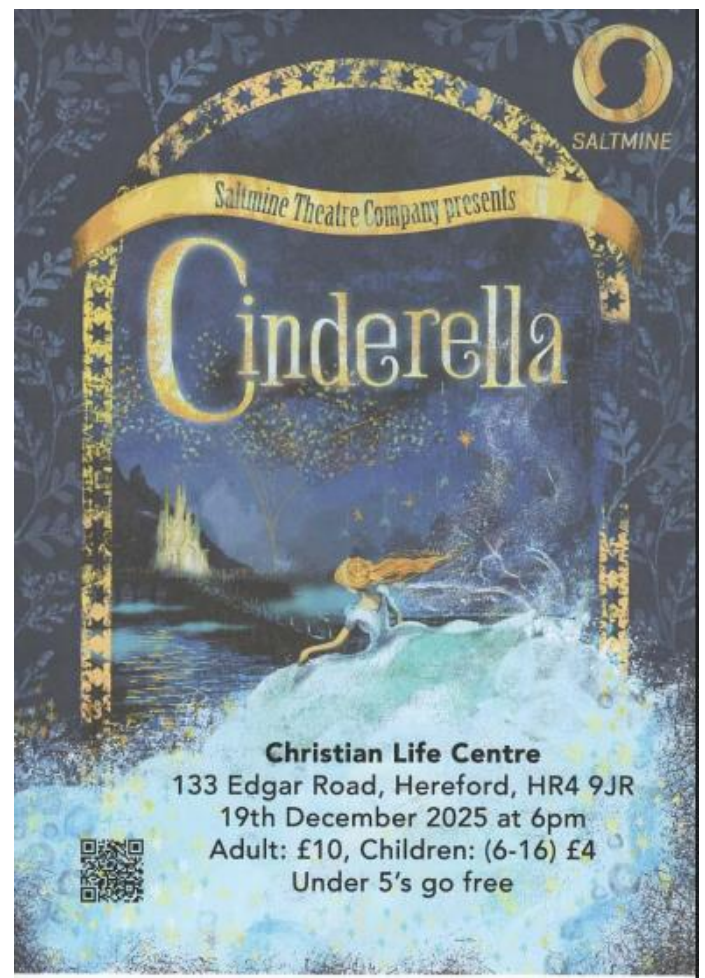
