Please pray, share these stories of compassion in action, and consider how your church might support this work.

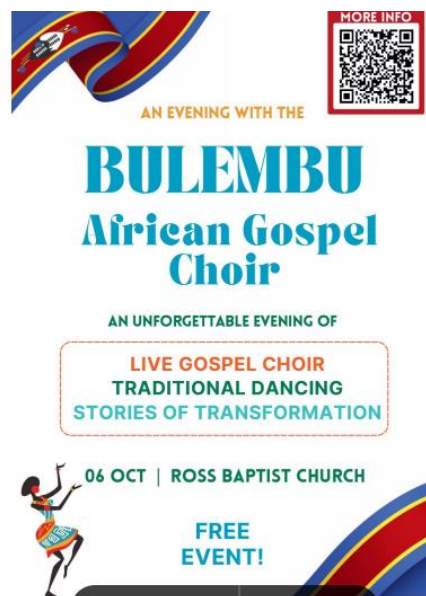
URC West Midlands Synod

This year's theme is Dreams & Realities, based on a portrait project featuring people living in deep hardship in Britain today.

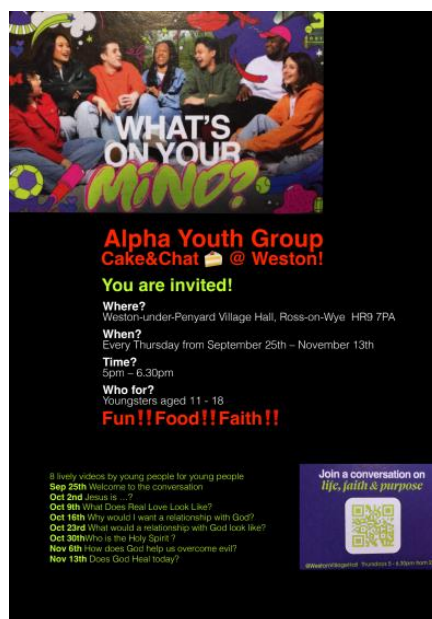
Church Action on Poverty is a national charity, which has been supporting and equipping churches and community groups for more than 40 years.

Clun celebrates 30 years of ecumenism



Last week the congregations of St George's Clun and Clun Methodist church gathered for a special service, led by Bishop Richard, to commemorate 30 years since the signing of a Declaration of Intent between the two churches. Both churches pledged to join in prayer and worship, to further each other's ministries, to support one another in deepening and renewing our traditions, to pray and study together, and to cooperate in ministry and pastoral care within our community.

During the service, Revd George Heinz, the Minister of Clun Methodist Church, preached on the humility of simply following God together, rather than competing for worshippers, and celebrated the great achievement of 30 years of working together, which predates the national Anglican-Methodist Covenant. Both churches re-dedicated themselves to the promises made in the original declaration.
