

Churches Together in Herefordshire's Annual Report – May 2024 - May 2025



This report sets out the key areas of work for Churches Together in Herefordshire over the past year. Emma Wright, the County Ecumenical Officer (the CEO) is employed by CTiH for 45 hours per month.

Churches Together Groups

Churches Together in Weobley

The annual Carol service raised money for the Disasters Recovery Committee and there was a surplus from the CTiW Christmas lunch. As a result, a total of £400 was sent over to the Disasters Emergency Committee. They also have organised bible studies over this past year with good attendance. CTiW also organised a Walk of Witness on Good Friday and an ecumenical service on Easter Sunday.

CTiW shared "this year's World Day of Prayer was a truly special occasion, bringing together members of different churches in a joyful spirit of unity and reflection. The service was held at St Thomas' RC Church Weobley, the ecumenical service (prepared by ladies from the Cook Islands) centred on the theme "I Made you Wonderful", inspired by Psalm 139.

Through prayers, readings and music, they celebrated the truth that each of us is uniquely made and deeply loved by God. It was a meaningful time of fellowship, shared worship, and encouragement."

CTiW also raised money during the service, which will support the ongoing work of the World Day of Prayer movement across the world.

Christians Together in Ewyas Harold

CTEH are looking at different ways of experiencing God's presence. They have discussed Taize, watched an Open the Book performance and a service organised by the "Come Gather Round Group" that provide services for residents at Dulas Court. They continue to collect donations for Christian Aid and present leavers books to those leaving Primary School. They also organised an ecumenical walk of witness.

Christians Together in Bromyard

CTiB organised an ecumenical Stations of the Cross around Bromyard as well as an ecumenical Walk of Witness with readings and alternative retellings of stories. Churches in Greater Whitbourne are putting on a community-led production of *Joseph and the Technicolour Dreamcoat* at the end of October. Everyone is welcome to attend and participate in the production. Churches Together in Ross-on-Wye and District

CTRD are keen for all the churches to continue to support chaplaincy in the secondary school and the primary schools in Ross-on-Wye. They organised another Light Up A Life service which was well attended. They also organised a bring and share lunch alongside WPCU events that took place from 20th-26th January. They continue to arrange an ecumenical sunset service which is held on a yearly basis (see the photos below.) They continue to organise a yearly Harvest lunch. They are also arranging a 'birthday picnic party' for Pentecost with food, games and activities and of course a birthday cake to celebrate the anniversary of Pentecost!



Churches Together in Leominster

Luston Methodist Chapel and Eye Church celebrated 50 years of ecumenical worship. They organised Lent lunches and sent donations to CAFOD and Christian Aid. The Walk of Witnesses were well attended. They also organised Bring and Share lunches alongside leading prayer walks around the town. CTL took part in the Christmas Tree Festival. Their theme was 'gifts' which allowed visitors the opportunity to write wishes for gifts that people would want to share

around the world on the Christmas decorations.

St Ethelbert's hosted a quiz night which was open to all.

The Moravian Church hosted the World Day of Prayer and encouraged everyone to wear fresh flowers as the material was developed by churches in the Cook Islands. CTL contributed a lantern to Light Up Leominster parade.





Christians Together in Orleton

CTiO organised weekly Lent groups and Easter Egg hunts that took place at the local pubs. They also helped donate goods to the local foodbanks and charities (Mary's Meals and Farming Minds.) They organised another time of carol singing at The Boot Pub and they also organised an Advent Study Group. The Christmas event of Stars and Angels was well attended by lots of families who gave really positive feedback. They led an Easter holiday club, going through the events of Holy Week with an interactive Last Supper, talking to the children about the importance of communion.

Churches Together in Kington

Praise services continue to be rotated between the churches in Kington three times a year and they also led Christmas Carols at the local pub. KICK gave a presentation at one of their meetings. Kington's Food Bank is continuing to thrive and they will organise a Pentecost themed praise event later on in the year.

Churches Together in Hereford

CTH organised a World Day of Prayer service which was well attended. They also supported the Saltmine Theatre's Passion Play that took place across Hereford with local people involved in the community cast. They also organised a Walk of Witness for Good Friday and are going to organise a local prayer walk for the summer.

LEAF



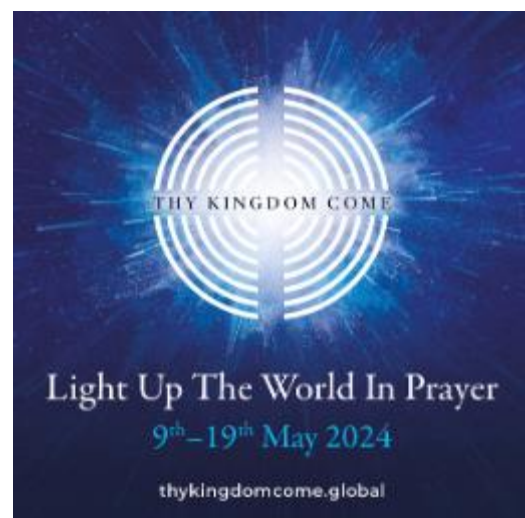
LEAF supports the Ledbury community through a wide range of initiatives. CAP offers debt counselling and a Money Management Course, while emotional well-being is addressed through counselling, school mentoring, and the Kintsugi Hope course. Spiritual needs are met via Alpha courses and joint church activities. Children enjoy events like Forest Fun and "Open the Book" storytelling. The Youth Hub is thriving, with weekly sessions and community food projects. Family support includes parenting courses and toddler groups. A new outdoor classroom project engages primary pupils, with plans to expand. Dedicated staff and volunteers ensure smooth operations. Donations are welcomed via LEAF's website. They

also recently celebrated 10 years of ecumenical prayer meetings at the beginning of June.



Thy Kingdom Come

Thy Kingdom Come are providing resources for their prayer initiative “Pray for 5.” This revolves around praying for 5 people who don’t know Jesus, and to pray for individuals each day of the weekday from Ascension to Pentecost from 29th May – 8th June. Thy Kingdom Come have also produced a separate prayer journal for their Light Up the World in Prayer event. Each day revolves around reflecting using a prayer tradition from different denominations. Enabling Group
